LAUNCH OF NEW LINK ROAD

The new link road providing motorists with an additional route between Pasir Ris and Punggol has opened! Located along Pasir Ris Industrial Drive 1, residents have been enjoying greater connectivity between the two towns since mid November.

The launch was commemorated with a family walk and cycling event that was flagged off by SM Teo and the Pasir Ris West grassroots leaders. On that day, participants also learnt from the Land Transport Authority that the new road is part of the expansion of the interchange between the Kallang-Paya Lebar Expressway (KPE) and the Tampines Expressway (TPE).

When the expansion is fully completed in June 2021, residents will benefit from: (i) more direct links to and from KPE and TPE, and (ii) better traffic at TPE between Punggol Way and KPE, and at access points into Punggol Town.

Mastan Abdul Bin Latip has spun himself a career as one of Singapore's most reputable turntable technicians, all thanks to his never-ending sense of curiosity.

They say one man's trash is another man's treasure. In 1993, when people were starting to discard turntables in favour of newer, more practical forms of music technology, Mastan was spending nights after work fishing out forsaken turntables from the rubbish chute.

After 20 years out at sea as a sailor and fulfilling his dreams of seeing the world, he docked permanently in 1990 and turned his attention to another latent interest – haircutting. Picking up the skills from a friend, he opened his first shop at Chai Chee Street a year later and began his second career as a barber. Even though his barbershop had found its footing and business was steady, wheels were already turning in his head with regard to what his next steps might be.

"I like to learn different things, plus I felt that I could not work as a barber for the rest of my life. When I was a sailor I wanted to explore the world, but at the same time, I was already prepared to learn haircutting because I know I will not be out at sea forever. So if I wanted to retire from barbering one day, I must have something else to do. While I was a barber, I was learning to repair turntables so when I retire, I could do something from home," Mastan says.

For pursuing this hobby in 1993 when CDs (compact discs) were starting to trend, Mastan was mocked for his impracticality but he stuck firmly to his guns. "I love music," he shares. "Music has always been my passion ever since my father bought our first gramophone when I was 10-years-old. Even when I sailed, I saved up and bought vinyl records from countries like Holland, America, and the United Kingdom."

The barbershop was soon stacked high with turntables he patched up (or was going to), and while he never had intentions of selling them, he eventually sold his first – a Lenco L-85 – to a customer for \$250. It took some years for word to spread, but soon even those who had called Mastan a "mad person" approached him for help to fix their faulty machines.

Sharing these memories from his flat in Pasir Ris, Mastan who is now 70, works fully from home repairing and selling vintage turntables, only occasionally venturing out to customers' homes to do troubleshooting or servicing. He retired his scissors and comb in 2011 when the barbershop closed, but has carried on with this passion, even earning the nickname 'The Spin Doktor' in the process. From sailor, to barber, to becoming an in-demand technician with niche skills, there is both relief and





pride in knowing that the trajectory he envisioned for himself has gone as planned.

These days, he specialises in fixing turntables from Lenco and Thoren, both Swiss brands which Mastan hails as amongst the best in the world. His reputation for being able to return these vintage machines back into precise working condition has pulled in clients from around the world including Britain, Indonesia, and even Paraguay who pay up to \$2,500 for the restored pieces.

With only a primary school education to show for, even his own brother has wondered how he became so skilled. It seems a good ratio of self-discipline, tenacity, and curiosity had pushed Mastan to spend the first 15 years of his turntable journey on the technical aspects of the machine and understanding their mechanisms inside out. He even picked up carpentry along the way so he could construct new consoles for the turntables.

There is no end to learning, and as one who continues to pick

up new skills in his life (next on the list: marketing), Mastan feels

see great value in Mastan's work is because of the effort he puts in to restore the machines to their most original forms. This also means turning away requests for modifications in order to preserve the value and authenticity of these vintage turntables.

Of course, strong work ethics help too. One reason why buyers

"I'm not an engineer," he emphasises. "We did not create these technologies. So my principle has always been to put the machine back as it is and move on. It's important to respect the original creation."

Just last year, Rolling Stone reported that vinyl is set to outsell CDs for the first time since 1986. This resurgence in popularity is expected to keep Mastan busy as more begin to lean into the analog music culture, confirming what he has believed almost 30 years ago that vinyl and his beloved turntables are here to stay.

"Prove to people you can do it and don't let obstacles stop you from reaching what you dream of," sums up Mastan of his experiences. "In life, whatever you want to do is possible."









Sengkang residents Gary Lim and Jordie are one of eight guide dog teams in Singapore. Hear firsthand from Jordie on life as a seeing eye dog!

Oh hello there! I almost didn't see you! Being Gary's guide dog requires 100 per cent of my attention almost all the time. I tend to get so focused on my work! Let me introduce myself: I'm Jordie, an eight-year-old Golden/Labrador Retriever mix originally from Australia. I came to Singapore via Guide Dogs Singapore (GDS), a wonderful non-profit association that empowers blind and visually-impaired people to live better lives. Gary Lim, my handler, began gradually losing his sight in his 30s from glaucoma. He became fully blind in 2016.

So how did we meet? Well, he approached GDS in 2015 when he had just five per cent of his vision left. After he went through an orientation & mobility course that assesses his suitability for handling dogs like me, we were paired up and the rest was history!

As Gary's eyes, I'm trained to lead him safely when moving around, ensuring he steers clear of danger as he goes from one place to another. We both had to undergo a three-week training to get used to this new partnership; Gary especially had to learn to give the right commands and react appropriately to my signals. One of the most important rule is when I stop moving, I'm telling Gary that there is an obstacle below (e.g. hoses, curbs), around, or above (e.g. tree branches) him, and he should feel around in order to avoid it.

I have to emphasise to you, dear reader, that I'm not an ordinary pet dog. Guide dogs are highly trained and have legal access to most public spaces. As Gary can't see, I am his eyes and his replacement for a white cane. Asking Gary to leave me at the door is akin to asking a person on a wheelchair to leave his device outside and walk in himself! Luckily this doesn't happen as much anymore!

If you see Gary and I out and about, don't be scared. I am softer than a marshmallow and I promise I'll never bite. When I'm on duty, please do not pet me, call out to me, feed me, or even whistle. Thank you for thinking I'm adorable, but those actions will distract me and cause Gary to lose his orientation!

It makes me blush to mention this... but Gary always says I'm the best thing to happen to him since he went blind. He calls me his third son! We both love sports like swimming and jogging, and even do volunteer work and outreach programmes together. We are lucky to have each other and wish more visually impaired people can have this life-changing opportunity. Anyway, I hope you enjoyed reading life as a guide dog from my humble perspective! Gotta get back to work! See you around!








With the help of our MPs and green-loving residents, seven young Jelutong tree saplings settled into their new homes just outside Block 126D Edgedale Plains on 1 December 2019. A part of the nationwide tradition that began in 1971, the annual Pasir Ris-Punggol Town Council Tree Planting Day continues to contribute to a cleaner and greener world, and to inculcate a greater sense of environmental awareness amongst residents.

Jelutong, whose scientific name is *Dyera costulata*, is a large native forest tree which can grow up to 80 m tall. Here is a fun fact: the latex tapped from the Jelutong is called gutta jelutong, and was once commonly used as the base for producing chewing gum.

When the planting ceremony was over, participants spent the rest of the morning going from station to station playing retro games like Kuti Kuti and indulging in snacks. There were also other craft activities such as terrarium making, face painting, and balloon twisting for all to enjoy.

Lijiang, China, is a perfect combination of historical sites, snowcapped mountains, and lakes. It is famed worldwide for its UNESCO Heritage Site, the Old Town of Lijiang. In the past, Lijiang was an important transit point along the ancient Tea Horse Road, where people in Sichuan and Yunnan exchanged tea for horses with people in Tibet.


Last December, I got to visit this spectacular city with my wife and our two daughters, Love & Joy. We took a direct flight from Singapore to Kunming, the capital city of Yunnan Province. From there, we travelled to Lijiang via an overnight train in a VIP cabin, which can sleep up to three adults or a family like us comfortably. This "National Culture Brand" train, whose stewards were specially selected to ensure they can speak English, is catered to foreign tourists like us.

Upon arrival, we visited the famous Jade Dragon Snow Mountain National Scenic Area and National Geological Park, very much fascinated by the trip up this majestic mountain by cable car to an observation platform at an elevation of 4,506m. But it was not to be as the winds were too strong for the cable car to operate, leaving us with no option but to visit another attraction within the park. It turned out to be a blessing in disguise, as we got to visit the Blue Moon Valley and captured many spectacular photographs of the Jade Dragon Snow Mountain from that vantage point.

The Blue Moon Valley gets its water out of the melting snow that runs from the mountains and forms four lakes and a few waterfalls. Its water often appears as an amazing turquoise-blue, which resembles a blue crescent moon. Together with a few free roaming calves, and the Jade Dragon Snow Mountain as backdrop, this combination gave us some picture perfect shots of Lijiang.

The following day, we visited the much anticipated Old Town of Lijiang. It is indeed a very beautiful and relaxing place, where you can spend the whole day walking along the numerous cobbled narrow pedestrian streets and small waterways to appreciate its unique architecture and culture. Also, there are many cafes/pubs for chilling out and countless shops full of food and crafts for sale. A must-try food for most Singaporeans is the BBQ durian, this truly is an outof-the-box way to consume the King of Fruits, and it actually tastes

The Lijiang tour is never completed without a song and dance show. Besides "Impression Lijiang" created by famous Chinese director Zhang Yimou, we also went for "The Legend of Romance Lijiang" at Lijiang Songcheng Tourist Area on the last evening. This show utilises IMAX 3D to introduce the rich culture and heritage of Lijiang, it will definitely fascinate your mind and give you a better understanding of their history.

Touching base with past employers will also allow you to follow up on advice and available opportunities.

4. Stay up to date
